1. Introductions & Updates

a. Safe Dates

- i. Libby facilitated at Fall Creek this morning. Going well so far.

- v. Abby finished group at Marriage and Family Services. They really enjoyed the program and want to continue doing this.
- vi. Abby shared about the "SPARKS" program. This program is for youth that have gone through juvenile intake and they are doing this instead of going to detention or other options. One Safe Dates group was already done and it went well. They will continue to do this. The staff through the SPARKS program is going to be trained, as well as the AmeriCorps member through LSS. This will help increase our capacity.
- vii. Group discussed getting the program into the Academy. Libby will ask someone that she knows that works there to see how to best get in.

- i. Decided to move the call toward the end of our meeting instead of the beginning. We will try this out this month.

c. Phoenix Park Bridge- Sexual Health Awareness Month Recap

- i.* The bridge was lit up teal on April 19th, WQOW did a live interview about Sexual Assault Awareness Month in front of the bridge with Health Department, Family Support Center and Amped Health Advocates.
- ii.* Amped Health Advocates also hosted a table at their high school where we brought the consent is signs and water bottles with stickers. Much conversation was generated from this. Advocates did a survey asking their peers about what they know about consent, healthy relationships, etc. Over 200 students filled out the survey. Abby will bring survey results to our next meeting.
